MISSION UPDATE - Randy Friesen (Multiply)

We are grateful for the 22 MB national conferences that Multiply serves with around the world, including our US and Canadian MB conferences. Over the past 120 years of mission work together, we have seen many churches planted and new extensions of our global family added. In 1990, we were a part of gathering 12 conferences of churches together to form the International Community of Mennonite Brethren (ICOMB). Today that has grown to 22 conferences of churches and represents over 500,000 members.

Multiply was born as the global mission ministry of the US and Canadian MB churches, however, we now also serve the global community of MB churches. We were invited to assist in church planting, discipleship and leadership training, community development, business-as-mission coaching, urgent humanitarian relief and other mission support activities. We also recognize that North America poses cross-cultural mission challenges, so we are assisting our conferences and churches in areas such as Congolese immigrant churches in the US, First Nations (Native American) ministries, diasporic (immigrant) and other church planting initiatives. New discipleship training programs are being developed regionally to support the ongoing mobilization and equipping of the church in mission

This period of COVID restrictions has reminded us that the Church must live on mission where we are, and not limit our activity to gatherings. I have heard of online discipleship clusters being formed that include Christ followers from Turkey, Panama and Canada. Global workers and mission leaders from around the world are being invited into local church Zoom calls regularly. While we are all looking forward to unrestricted in-person gatherings again, our mission cannot be defined by them. Globally, we are being reminded that the travel of North American workers also does not define our work. We both send missionaries and serve national mission leaders. In places where our missionaries have been unable to travel in this past year because of restrictions, it has been our national partners who continue the work of making disciples and planting churches. We really need each other in the global church if we are to be effective and fruitful in our mission together!
