MISSION UPDATE - Cory & Masami Giesbrecht (Multiply)

Greetings from Osaka, Japan!

During this month there have been two events which prompt us to think about what we are doing and why we are doing it. One of these events was that the guy I (Cory) call Tatsu got arrested again and the other event was that our fostering relationship with H. came to an end.

Last week when I was on the train on my way to meet with Tatsu I felt God was urging me (through the song "Friend" by Jonathan Ogden) to be a friend to him. I was surprised when he did not show up at the appointed time - for the second time in a row. I found out from the volunteers at the soup kitchen that he had been arrested for violence. This was not surprising since recently he had also attacked some members of the park church. (causing me some angst) When that had happened I had shared with a good friend how, because of many difficult incidents, I was feeling anything but love for Tatsu - the very person I was trying to love. Thanks to God (and to the prayers of this brother) I was able to have a compassionate heart when I visited him in prison a few days later. We have been investing in our foster son H. on and off for about a year now so it was difficult to hear that the social workers have decided to cut short the relationship and keep him in the orphanage. At times like this we are reminded that our investments are kept in heaven, and not on earth. This was a humbling experience and it feels like God is freeing us from our drive to prove something through performance.

If you will humour me a little:

Do we do good "for goodness sake"? If so perhaps Jesus would say "Do not even Pagans do that?".

Do we do good "for God's sake"? This can get tiring and a little off track. Do we do good "In Christ" or with Christ? In this case we are in heavenly places regardless of worldly failure or success. We can put down the shield of apathy and cynicism (which we use to protect ourselves from hard feelings and risks) and take up the shield of faith and trust in God.

Thanks for your prayers regarding the park church. The rate of baptisms seems to have reduced but God is at work in transforming the lives of the baby Christians. Kawashima san recently quit smoking after over 40 years of smoking, for the sake of "the name". Nozomi san experienced deliverance on the one-year anniversary of her baptism and now is saying that "Jesus has become my everything!". Her friend Aya who was baptized recently is now saying "Come to the park all you thousands of sinners! We are open!". You can imagine how encouraging it is to hear these simple people saying these amazing things!
