Government Restrictions Update:

Our local provincial health restrictions continue to be eased and that is very good news. The biggest impact for us is that the attendance restrictions remain at 50% of building capacity, or 150 people, whichever is larger. Since we have a very large building, and a sanctuary that can comfortably seat over 600 people, this means that our entire congregation can now attend church again. No need to be concerned about robbing someone of a spot. If you want to attend, we have plenty of room for you!

Important notes to be aware of:

- Masks are still recommended, but no longer required.

- The government has specified that we shall reasonably maintain a physical distance of 2 metres.

- We are still required to take attendance. You may optionally register to attend in advance at www.pachurch.ca/connect. Then, please check in with a greeter once you enter the building. Guests, we need either a phone number or email for contact tracing as per the government.

- We will continue to provide translation units for those who need them.

- Please check your mailbox some are getting quite full. :-).

MISSION UPDATE - Dave & Louise Sinclair-Peters (Multiply)

Starting over, again. And again...

Since moving to Mae Sot last month, God has led us to the cutest little Thai house. The neighbors are very kind and the police station across the street makes our house one of the safest places in the world. If I ever need help, I will just lean out the window and yell, "Chuay-Duay" (help!) I'm sure a 100 police officers would come running!

We had just arranged the furniture and planted a beautiful little garden in the front of the house when our landlord called to say, "the water is coming." Being new to Mae Sot, I wondered, "hmm, what does that mean?"

It wasn't too long before we looked out the window to observe the water rising above the tops of the trees, transforming our yard into a lake!

The first time the water rose high, I was almost ready to wave at my police neighbors and yell "Chuay-Duay!" Then, we took a look at the long stilts our house is built on and we surmised, "Maybe someone has survived a flood here before?" After the water came up and went down about three times, we were like Winnipegers driving through a snow storm, we felt like old pros.

Yesterday we visited a relative of one of our church members who is about to have a baby. She had just been informed by her doctor that with COVID cases surging, she can not go to the hospital to deliver her baby.

As a migrant worker, there is very little medical care available for Myanmar people living on the border. When we saw how scared she felt, we thanked God for bringing us right to her door. We shared the Good News with her. We promised her that Jesus would not leave her side as she delivered this baby. We opened up the mp3 solar powered Bible and her whole family started to listen. When we asked her if she had ever heard the name of Jesus before, she said, "never." Amazingly, the Holy Spirit opened her heart to believe our testimony. She accepted the Lord as her Savior. We encouraged her to listen to the MP3 whenever she was resting, and especially at night or when she is afraid. We promised we would come back and tell her more about Jesus so that she could receive all the blessings God has to give her!

For Further Reflection


Use these questions for personal reflection or with your small group.
